



ARIZONA PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, nearly 40 Million Americans have Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD); and
WHEREAS, as high as 48.43% of the people with Chronic Kidney Disease and/or heart failure suffer from a condition known as Hyperkalemia (high potassium); and
WHEREAS, only 57% of kidney patients with a history of high potassium understand the term hyperkalemia; and
WHEREAS, 60% of kidney patients reported that optimized potassium levels had a positive impact of their life; and
WHEREAS, Hyperkalemia (High Potassium) can cause: weakness, Fatigue, Tingling or numbness, Nausea & vomiting, Difficulty breathing, Paralysis, Irregular heartbeat, Heart attack, Sudden death from cardiac complications.
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Katie Hobbs, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim, May 1, 2026, as,

HIGH POTASSIUM AWARENESS DAY


